**Regulations:**

- 1)** All exhibits (except for floral art) must be grown by the exhibitor or have been in his or her possession for at least 2 months prior to the show.

- 2) Exhibits to be shown in containers of exhibitor's own choice except where otherwise stated. Definition of a container is a receptacle of any shape or design in which plant material is exhibited.

**Note:** (i) A container exhibit must consist of 2 or more stems.  
(ii) Unless otherwise stated an exhibit must consist of one kind of plant only.  
(iii) NAME ROSES WHERE POSSIBLE.

### **CUT FLOWERS AND FLOWERING SHRUBS AND TREES**

- 1) THREE FULL BLOOM ROSES, shown separately (must show stamens)
- 2) THREE ROSES different varieties, shown separately
- 3) ONE ROSE. any variety (no buds)
- 4) CONTAINER OF MIXED ROSES 6 – 10 stems no buds be shown
- 5) ONE STEM OF FLORIBUNDA (CLUSTER) ROSE
- 6) MINIATURE ROSE. (no buds)
- 7) ONE STEM OF DAVID AUSTEN ROSE
- 8) ONE STEM OF DAVID AUSTEN ROSE
- 9) CONTAINER OF CUT FLOWERS, one variety Container no more than 30cm
- 10) CONTAINER OF MIXED CUT FLOWERS AND/OR SHRUBS Container no more than 30cm
- 11) ONE FUCHSIA, single variety
- 12) ONE FUCHSIA. double variety
- 13) THREE ZONAL PELARGONIUMS (Geraniums) not necessarily different, shown separately
- 14) THREE REGAL PELARGONIUMS. not necessarily different, shown separately
- 15) THREE CARNATIONS, not necessarily different, shown separately
- 16) ONE BLOOM OR STEM OF IRIS
- 16a) ONE STEM OF LILIUM, any variety
- 17) ONE CUT OF THREE DIFFERENT KINDS OF CUT FLOWERS, each stem shown separately
- 18) SWEET PEAS, any number of stems
- 19) CONTAINER OF FLOWERING SHRUBS, not less than four varieties Container no more than 30cm
- 20) CONTAINER OF FOLIAGE, not less than four varieties Container no more than 30cm
- 21) CONTAINER OF MIXED AUSTRALIAN NATIVE SHRUBS and/or FLOWERS, at least four different kinds Container no more than 30cm

### **CONTAINER GROWN PLANTS**

**Note carefully: only ONE plant to a container unless otherwise stated.**

- 22) CONTAINER OF MAIDEN HAIR FERN
- 23) CONTAINER OF FERN (excluding maiden hair fern)
- 24) CONTAINER PLANT IN BLOOM
- 25) CONTAINER PLANT foliage only (excluding fern)
- 26) CONTAINER PLANT OF ORCHID
- 27) ONE CONTAINER, MULTIPLE PLANTING
- 28) HANGING CONTAINER IN BLOOM
- 29) HANGING CONTAINER, FOLIAGE ONLY
- 30) HANGING CONTAINER, MULTIPLE PLANTING

**NOTE: hanging rack is provided**

- 36) ARRANGEMENT OF FLOWERS IN NOVEL CONTAINER**
- 37) ARRANGEMENT OF MIXED FLOWERS, with any natural foliage**
- 38) ARRANGEMENT OF FLOWERS IN TINTS AND SHADES OF ONE COLOUR, some foliage allowed**
- 39) ARRANGEMENT OF IRISES**
- 40) ARRANGEMENT OF ROSES**
- 41) A DRIED ARRANGEMENT**
- 42) ARRANGEMENT OF FRESH FOLIAGE**
- 43) MINIATURE ARRANGEMENT, fresh or dried, not more than 10cm (4") overall**
- 44) ARRANGEMENT OF ANY OTHER FLOWERS, not previously mentioned, not necessarily horticulture**

#### **FRUIT & VEGETABLES**

- 45) THREE ONIONS with minimum 4 stalk**
- 46) ONE HEAD OF LETTUCE WITH STALK**
- 47) ONE HEAD OF CABBAGE WITH STALK**
- 48) TWELVE PODS OF GREEN PEAS**
- 49) THREE STALKS OF RHUBARB with 10cm (4") of leaf showing**
- 50) TWELVE PODS OF BROAD BEANS**
- 51) BUNCH OF SILVER BEET**
- 52) PUNNET OF STRAWBERRIES**
- 53) THREE LEMONS WITH STALKS**
- 54) COLLECTION OF 5 VEGETABLES and/or fruit, displayed in a basket or box, root vegetables to be in bunches of 3**
- 55) FRESH MIXED HERBS, 6 varieties Staged separately in water. Name if possible**
- 56) THREE CARROTS**

#### **JUNIOR SECTION (14 Years and under)**

- 57) PLANT IN POT OR HANGING CONTAINER**
- 58) DECORATED SAUCER, sand not water. \$5 donated by Yea Garden Club**
- 59) ARRANGEMENT OF FLOWERS**
- 60) ARRANGEMENT OF FOLIAGE**
- 61) ANY NOVELTY ARRANGEMENT MOSTLY HORTICULTURAL MATERIAL**
- 62) ONE ROSE**
- 63) MINIATURE ROSE**
- 64) ONE CUT FLOWER, not a rose**
- 65) A MINIATURE GARDEN, plant material, accessories allowed, on a shoe box lid \$10 donated by Goulburn Valley Nurseries**
- 66) ANIMAL OR NOVELTY IN FRUIT OR VEGETABLES, must be stable. \$5 donated by Yea Garden Club**
- 67) LETTUCE**
- 68) THREE STALKS RHUBARB with 10cm leaf showing**
- 69) SIX PANSIES, SEPARATELY STAGED**
